*Lake Research Partners designed and administered this pre-election and election night omnibus survey which was conducted by phone using professional interviewers October 31 – November 3, 2020. The questions about voting and the demographics reached a total of 2,400 registered voters nationwide who voted in the 2020 elections – 1,065 interviews among voters who were reached on landlines and 1,335 interviews among voters who were reached on cell phones, with 600 using a text to online method. Issue questions reached a total of 1,200 registered voters nationwide who voted in the 2020 elections (margin of error of +/-2.8%). The data were weighted to reflect the aggregated presidential vote as reported in the 2020 exit polls, as well as by gender, age, race, party identification, education, marital status, union household, and census region to reflect the actual proportions of the electorate. The survey has a margin of error of ±2.0% at the 95% confidence interval.*
