WHEREAS:	Employers are crucial in providing opportunities for work experience, career paths, and the dignity that comes through labor; and
WHEREAS:	To benefit Minnesota's economy and its competitiveness in the global marketplace, the State of Minnesota must value and empower the contributions of all people, including those with disabilities; and
WHEREAS:	The State of Minnesota, in accordance with Minnesota's Olmstead Plan, is committed to providing Minnesotans with disabilities with a continuum of work options that best meet individual needs and choices in a person-centered manner.
